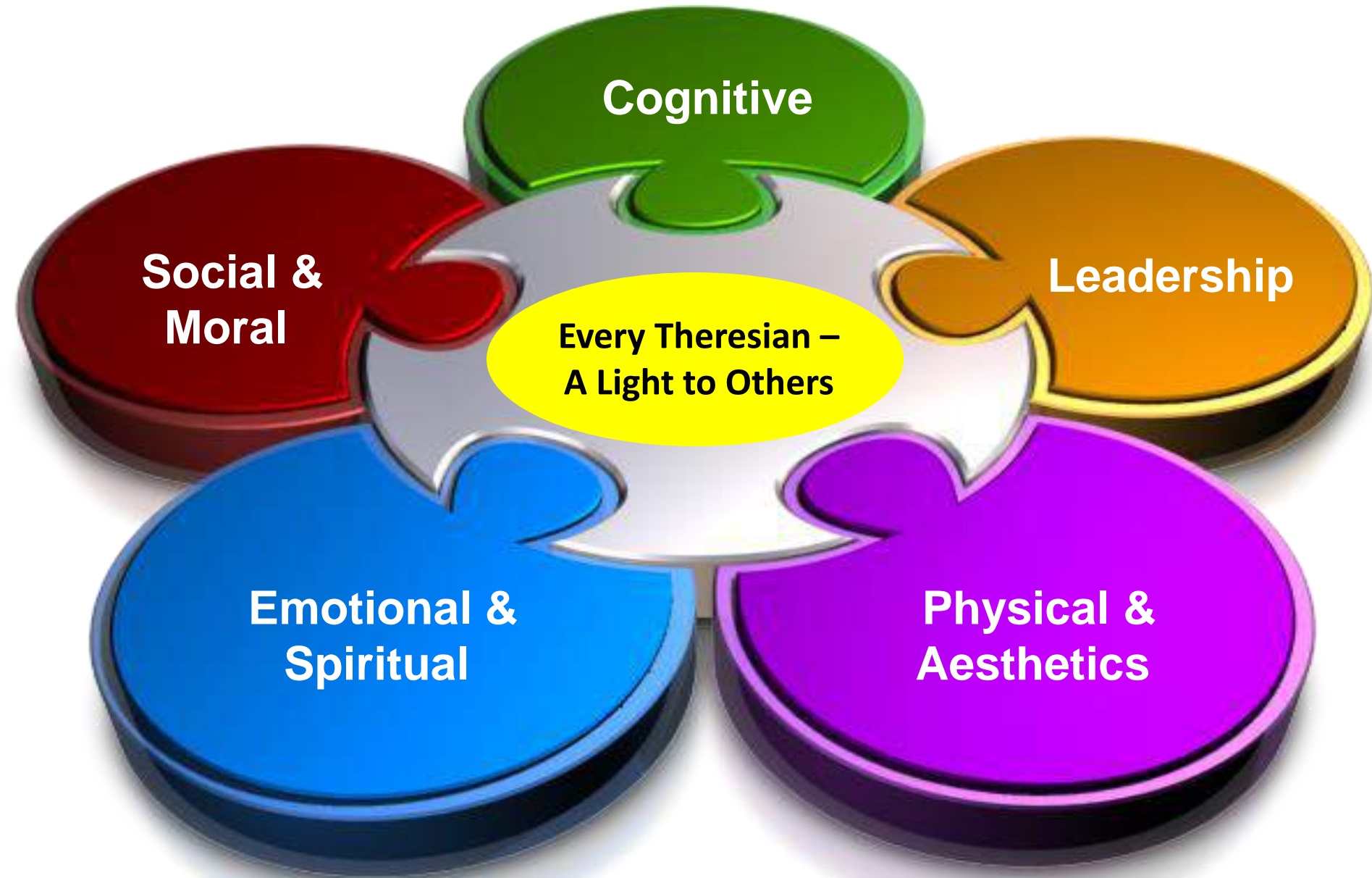

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Why Full SBB?

- Full SBB is part of MOE's ongoing efforts to nurture the joy of learning and develop multiple pathways to **cater to the different strengths and interests of our students.**
- We want to:

Allow greater customisation of learning to develop each child to their fullest potential

Mitigate the inadvertent labelling and stigmatisation due to streaming

Facilitate access to post-secondary pathways that cater to students with different strengths and learning pace



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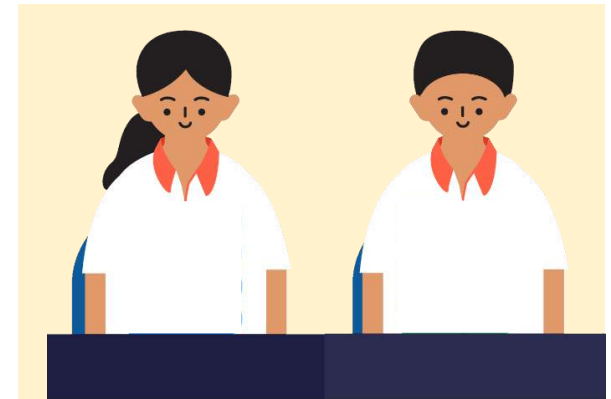
How will Full SBB be rolled out in our School?

Implementing **mixed form classes with the provision of a common curriculum (CCE, Music, PE, Art, D&T, FCE)**

We are **organising form classes in new ways** to include students from different courses.

- They will take a **common curriculum** for lower secondary CCE, Music, PE, Art, D&T, FCE which will account for one-third of curriculum time.

Common Curriculum Subjects

Common Curriculum Subjects

Examinable Subjects:

- Art
- Design & Technology (D&T)
- Food and Consumer Education (FCE)

Non-examinable Subjects:

- Character & Citizenship Education (CCE)
- Music
- Physical Education (PE)

The six common curriculum subjects would each have a single syllabus for all students at Lower Secondary levels.

- Content and learning outcomes of these subjects are taught at a common level that is accessible by all students.
- Teachers will adopt a range of approaches to teach the subjects catering to the different learning needs of their students.
- Students will learn the basics of the subjects from Secondary One and deepen their learning over the two years. They will also have opportunities to learn from different tasks and assignments tailored to their learning progress.

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How will Full SBB be implemented?

Existing Subject-Based Banding (SBB) Provisions

- **For students posted to the Exp course**, they will take all non-common curriculum subjects at the Exp level.
- **For students posted to N(A) or N(T) course**, they have the flexibility to take subjects (i.e. EL, MTL, Math, Sci) at a more demanding level, if they meet the eligibility criteria as follows:

Option to take a subject at:	PSLE Subject Grade under the AL system:
Express level	AL 5 or better in a Standard level subject
N(A) level	AL 6 or better in a Standard level subject or AL A in a Foundation level subject

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Eligibility Criteria to offer HMTL

- Students with a PSLE Score of **8 or better** and offer MTL at PSLE
- Students with a PSLE Score of **9 – 14** and obtained **AL1 / AL2 in MTL or Distinction / Merit in HMTL**



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Higher Mother Tongue (HMT)

- Students who are offered **Higher Mother Tongue (HMT)** by MOE (based on PSLE results) will be given an **Eligibility Letter**.
- Submit **acceptance of offer** for HMT to HOD/MTL Mdm Lee Chai Yen on **27 Dec 2022**.

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Admission Criteria to offer HMTL

- Students who missed the eligibility criteria based on PSLE results will be given an opportunity to try again for HMTL eligibility via **Secondary 1 End-Of-Year examination**.
- Students **MUST** score **75%** and higher in MTL End-Of-Year Examination.
- Students **MUST** score **60%** or higher in the overall average percentage.



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Third Languages

- Eligible students who had applied for 3rd Language would have been informed if your application is successful / unsuccessful.
- 3rd Languages includes Chinese (Special Programme), Malay (Special Programme), Bahasa Indonesia, Arabic, French, German, Japanese and Spanish.
- 3rd Languages are conducted **outside curriculum hours.**

To apply for AEP @ NJC at Secondary 1:

- ✓ Must pass a selection exercise comprising short art tasks and a portfolio interview.
- ✓ Requires endorsement from student's own secondary school.
- ✓ Application window: 3 – 16 January 2023



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Art Elective Programme Centre-Based Learning @ NJC



To apply for AEP Centre at Secondary 1

The selection exercise typically:

- focuses on evaluating students' suitability based on basic art skills, imagination, expressive and conceptual capacities, artistic dispositions, etc.
- makes fair consideration for students who may have had less access to additional developmental experiences and resources relative to their peers.

Students' portfolio are not expected to be extensive. Portfolios should be assembled to best reflect students' artistic abilities and potential in relation to their own interests and experiences.

Suitable works done in school are perfectly acceptable.

The **MEP curriculum** aims to develop students as practitioners, scholars, advocates and leaders in the arts.

The curriculum includes:

- ✓ An extended and balanced music curriculum that develops skills in Listening, Creating, Performing and Research
- ✓ An in-depth study of Asian, Classical, Jazz, Popular and Multimedia genres
- ✓ Access to specialised facilities such as practice studios, music technology equipment and other resources (e.g. scores and audio-visual materials).
- ✓ Opportunities to learn and collaborate with MEP and EMP students from other schools.
- ✓ Opportunities to learn from music industry professionals through masterclasses and studio sessions.
- ✓ Opportunity to offer Higher Music syllabus at O-Level.



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Music Elective Programme Centre-Based Learning



Anglo-Chinese School (Independent) (ACS (I)) and Dunman High School (DHS) operate as **MEP Centres** which extend the programme to students from all non-MEP/EMP schools. Students will travel either to ACS (I) or DHS for their weekly lessons throughout the four-year secondary level programme and enjoy the same specialised and rigorous MEP curriculum in Listening, Creating, Performing and Research.

To apply for MEP Centres at Secondary 1:

- ✓ Must pass a selection exercise comprising an e-Audition, e-Listening Test and e-Interview.
- ✓ Requires endorsement from student's own secondary school.
- ✓ Application window: 3- 16 January 2023



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Music Elective Programme Centre-Based Learning



To apply for MEP (Centres) at Secondary 1

The selection exercise usually involves an audition, listening test and interview to assess students' potential and interest. The exercise comprises:

i.Audition: Perform 2 contrasting solo pieces on an instrument (e.g., piano, trumpet, rebab, erhu, sitar) or voice, lasting no longer than 5 minutes in total.

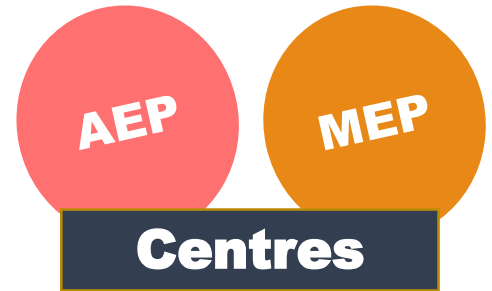
ii.Listening Test: Listen to 8–10 short musical extracts, taken from both Western and non-Western musical traditions, and respond to 25 MCQ questions.

iii.Interview: Share musical aspirations and interests with a panel of music teachers. Applicants who have composed music could upload their scores and/or recordings as part of their online application.

You would have to

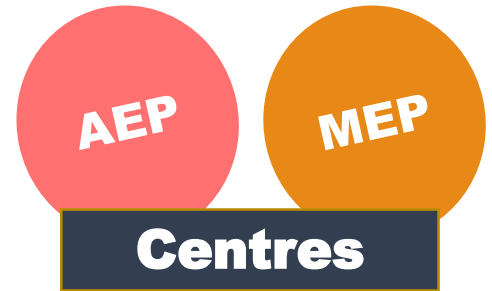
- i. Manage your time well because you would need to travel to Centres for lessons one afternoon a week.
- ii. Commit to the scheduled lessons, assignments and additional projects.

- To apply for AEP/ MEP Centres at Secondary 1,
- When posted to a secondary school that does not offer AEP/MEP/EAP/EMP, apply for AEP/ MEP Centres in the first two weeks of January.
 - Pass Selection Exercise at the start of the Secondary 1 school year.
 - Begin AEP/MEP lessons from Sec 1, Term 2.

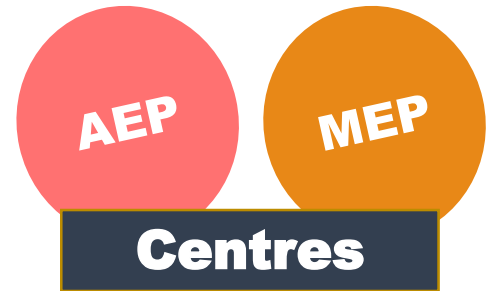

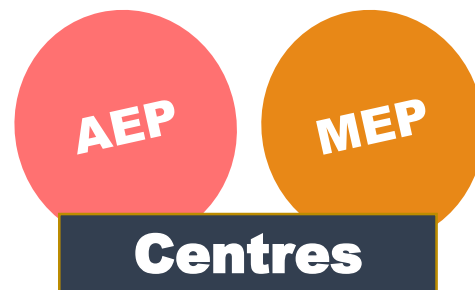

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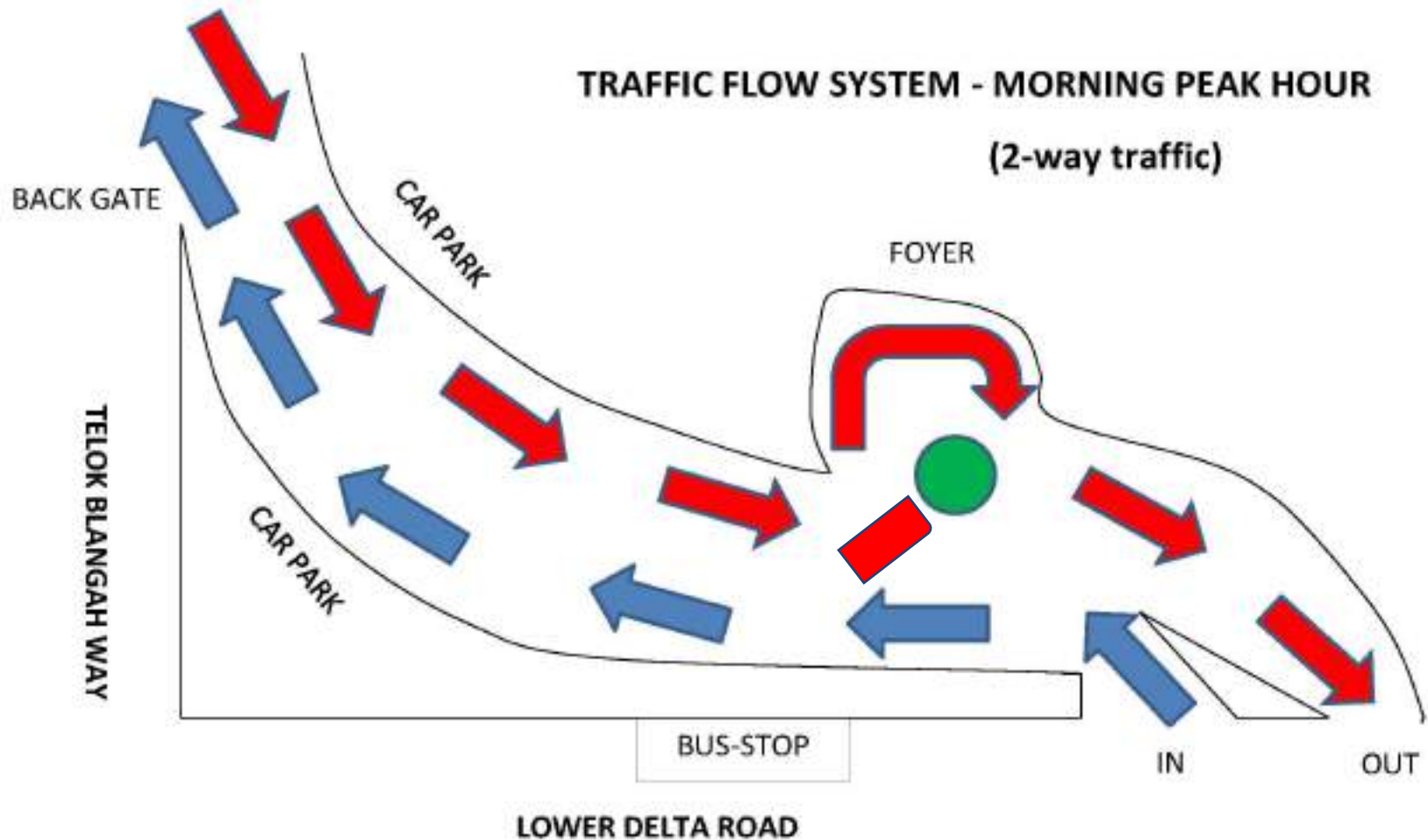
Bus Concession Pass

- You can purchase the **Bus Concession Pass (BCP)** using your Primary SSC but need to purchase the BCP for **Secondary School**.



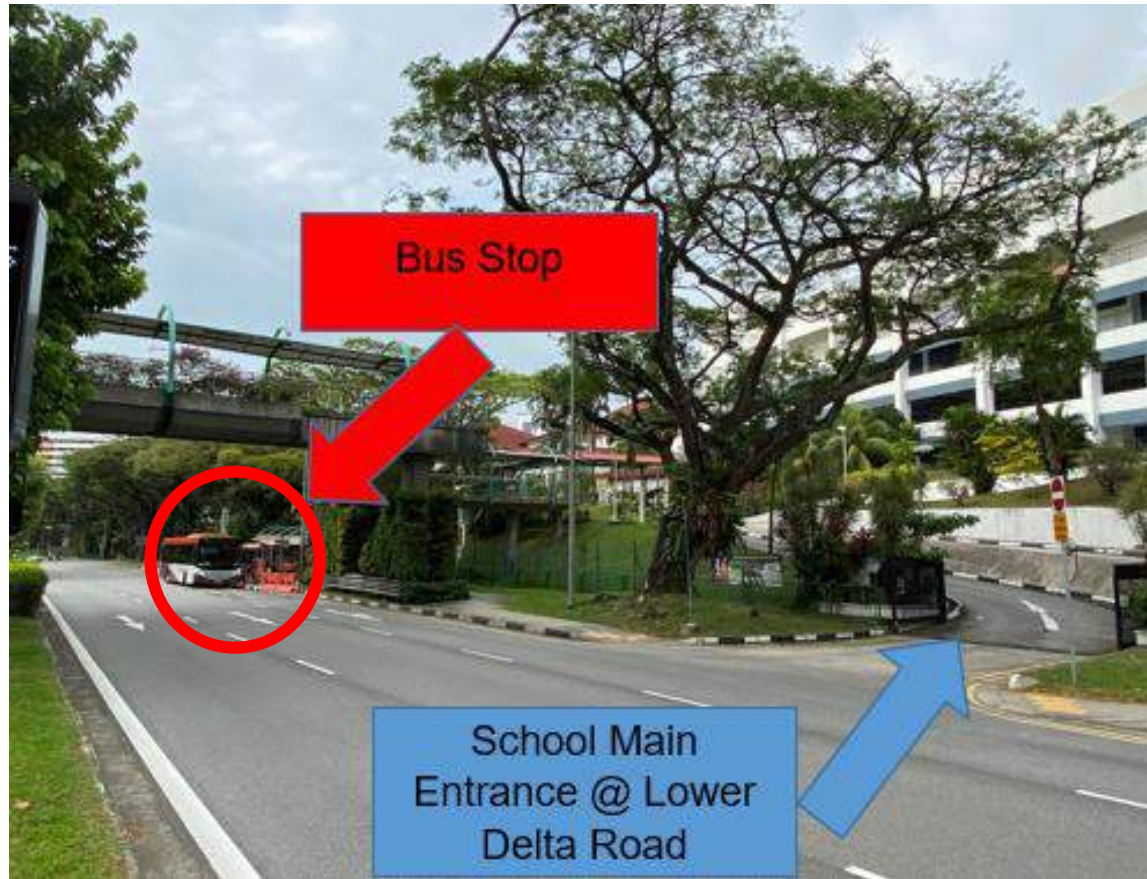
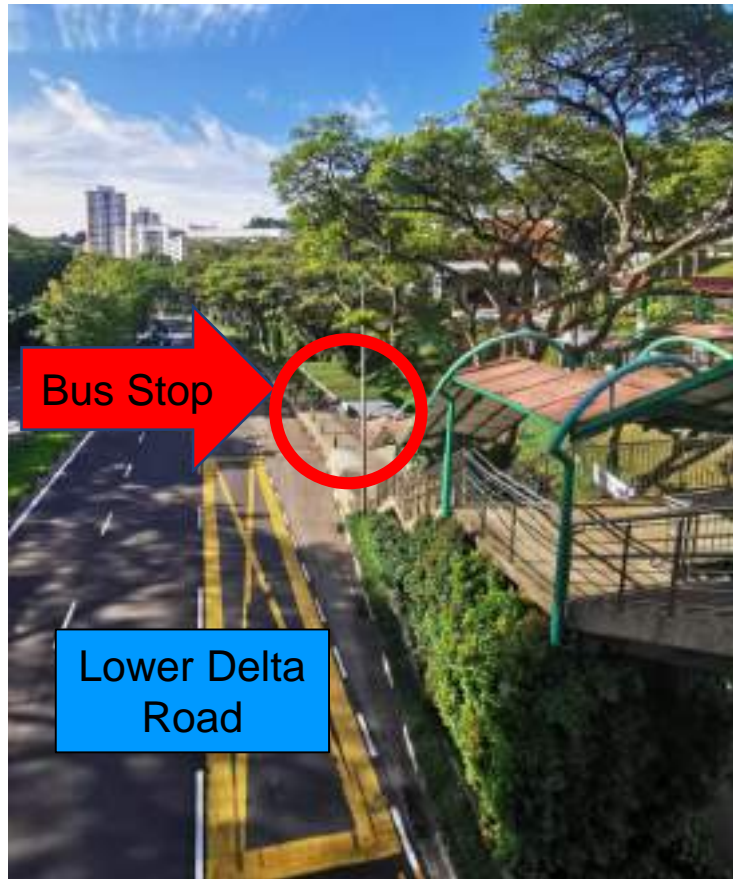
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Morning Peak Traffic



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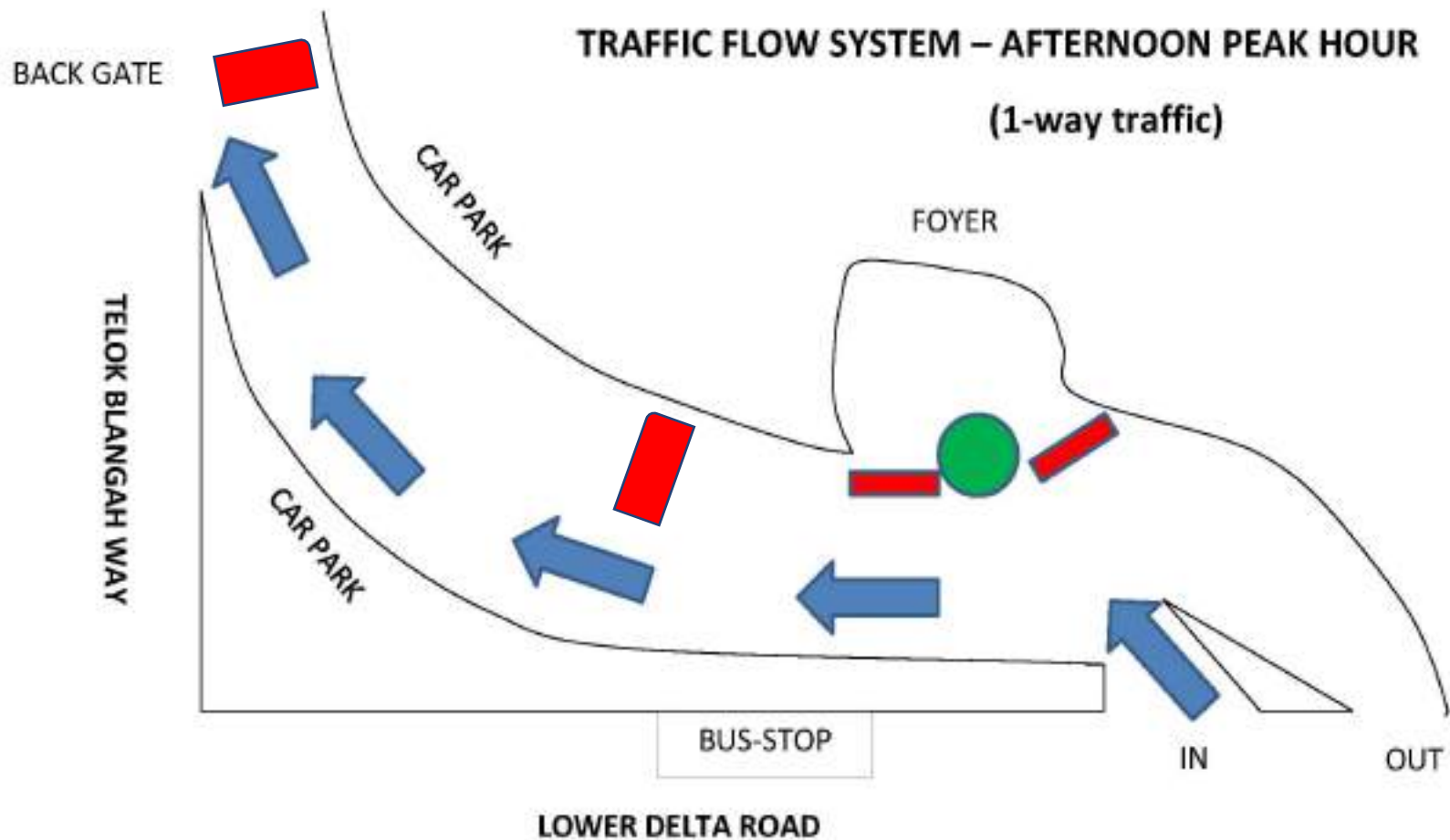
